Germany, seeing that Russia was mobilizing, declared war on Russia. France was then drawn against Germany and Austria-Hungary. Germany attacked France on the way through Belgium, pulling Britain into war. Then Japan went to war to support its British allies. Later, Italy and the United States will join the Allies (Britain, France, Russia, etc.). belterz/Getty Images Imperialism is when a country increases their power and wealth, bringing additional territories under their control, usually without completely colonizing or resettling them. Before the First World War, several European countries had made competing imperialist claims in Africa and parts of Asia, making them points of contention. Because of the raw materials that these regions could provide, the tensions around which country had the right to exploit these areas High. Increasing competition and a desire for greater empires have led to an increase in confrontation that helped propel the world into World War I. Dreadnought was soon out-classed as the Royal Navy and Kaiserliche Marine quickly expanded their ranks with increasingly modern and powerful warships. By 1914, Germany had nearly 100 warships and two million trained soldiers. Great Britain and Germany significantly increased their naval forces during this time period. Moreover, particularly in Germany and Russia, the military establishment began to have more influence in public policy. This increase in militarism has helped to push countries involved in war. Mariusz Paździora Much of the origin of the war was based on the desire of the Slavic peoples in Bosnia and Herzegovina to no longer be part of Austria-Hungary, but instead to be part of Serbia. This particular essentially nationalist and ethnic uprising led directly to the assassination of Archduke Ferdinand, which was the event that brought down the scales in the war. But more generally, nationalism in many of the countries across Europe contributed not only to the beginning but also to the expansion of the war throughout Europe and Asia. As each country tried to prove its sovereignty and power, the war became more complex and protracted. Bettmann / Contributor The direct cause of The First World War that made the aforementioned elements come into play (alliances, imperialism, militarism, and nationalism) was the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand of Austria-Hungary. In June 1914, a Serbian-nationalist terrorist group called the Black Hand sent teams to assassinate The Archduke. Their first attempt failed when a driver dodged a grenade that fell on their car. However, later that day a Serbian nationalist named Gavrilo Princip shot Archduke and his wife while driving in Sarajevo, Bosnia, which was part of Austria-Hungary. They died of their wounds. The murder in protest at Austria-Hungary in control of this region: Serbia wanted to take over Bosnia and Herzegovina. Ferdinand's murder led Austria-Hungary to declare war on Serbia. When Russia began mobilizing to defend its alliance with Serbia, Germany declared war on Russia. Thus began the expansion of the war to include all those involved in the defence alliances. World War I saw a change in the war, from the hand-to-hand style of the earlier wars to the inclusion of weapons that used technology and removed the man from close combat. The war had extremely high casualties of over 15 million dead and 20 million wounded. The face of war would never be the same again. Again.
